AFTA debunks TCF claims

THE Australian Federation of Travel Agents (AFTA) has debunked suggestions that the former Travel Compensation Fund (TCF) would have helped following the "catastrophic collapse" of Tempo Holidays/Bentours, issuing a formal Advisory Note to help provide clarity on the current situation (TD breaking news).

AFTA said in the face of the company's failure, some agents have been seeking the return of the TCF "under the false belief that it would provide some level of consumer protection.

"The simple fact is that no government, nor industry, is prepared to cover the losses of illegal behaviour by a wholesaler," the note says, adding that at this stage the fate of the company is still to be determined.

"In this case specifically there is still the unknown fact that the parent company in India remains in operation, and has

considerable assets at its disposal.

"To simply suggest a prior, flawed scheme would resolve matters is simply not true," AFTA said, urging the industry to focus on facts rather than fiction.

The note addresses discussions currently taking place on social media channels, highlighting key drawbacks of the TCF which saw successful businesses forced to finance a "get out of jail free" slush fund for failed companies.

The AFTA Chargeback Scheme (ACS) has also protected agents who are part of the program for any credit card payments to Tempo/Bentours up until 22 Aug, AFTA CEO Jayson Westbury said.

He noted that the AFTA team was available to talk to members about their situations relating to the collapse.

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




TAG Tramada deal

MU Shanghai-Perth trial

CHINA Eastern Airlines will operate its first direct flights to Perth from Shanghai over a five-week trial during the Chinese New Year period in 2020.

From 12 Jan-17 Feb. the carrier will offer three non-stop flights per week between Perth (PER) and Shanghai Pudong International Airport (PVG).

The announcement is a result of a partnership between the State Govt, through Tourism WA, Perth Airport and Tourism Australia and follows an extra \$1m in funding allocated by Tourism WA this year to marketing in Shanghai.

WA Premier Mark McGowan said "Having never flown directly to Perth, these China Eastern direct flights will make it that much easier for Chinese visitors to access the great tourism experiences we have to offer in Western Australia".

Perth Airport Chief Executive Officer Kevin Brown said the

trial would "add much needed seats to the market during this seasonal busy period.

"If the trial is successful and leads to the introduction of three weekly services year-round, it could mean an additional \$40 million in tourism spend for the WA economy."

The flights will be operated on Mon, Wed and Fri and utilise a 232-seat A330-200 aircraft.

Virtuoso cuts C&K

VIRTUOSO has confirmed the cessation of its partnership with Cox & Kings (C&K), due to ongoing financial issues of C&K India.


C&K was a preferred supplier to Virtuoso in the USA and Dubai.



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DFAT Smartraveller revamp

THE Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade will no longer encourage Australian travellers to register when going abroad, under a major makeover of its Smartraveller advisory platform.

Set to roll out in Nov this year, the revamp includes a newlook website which will make advisories "easier to read and navigate," while travellers will be able to subscribe to receive travel advice updates via email.

"We'll also offer a new option to get SMS 'critical alerts' in a crisis," the Department noted.

Registration, which is currently part of the Smartraveller offering for all travellers, will only be activated when there's an overseas crisis once the new arrangements are implemented.

Registration will be offered through a simplified online form which will appear on the Smartraveller site when overseas

Virgin Hotels Miami

VIRGIN Hotels has announced plans to launch Virgin Hotels Miami which is scheduled to open its doors in 2023.

To be located in the city's financial district, the 40-storey, 250-room property will feature large meeting and event spaces.

It will also offer multiple dining and drinking outlets, such as the brand's signature culinary experience Commons Club, as well a beer garden with live music venue and coffee shop.

VA lodges Haneda

VIRGIN Australia has applied for an allocation of one frequency per day for passenger services during daytime hours from Brisbane Airport to Haneda Airport in Tokyo.

The submission notes it intends to utilise its proposed capacity for joint services with All Nippon Airways, granted for five years from the date of determination.

Virgin Australia last week signalled its intent to compete with Qantas for the upgraded allocation (TD 18 Sep), with VA applying for one of the two daily slots up for grabs and QF seeking both slots (TD 17 Sep).

The increased capacity follows the expanded Australia-Japan Air Services Agreement (TD 17 Sep).

With two carriers applying for the same limited capacity, the International Air Services Commission is inviting submissions about the applications, due 02 Oct.

AIRBNB is sending five lucky people to Antarctica, all expenses paid, but of course, there's a catch.

The Antarctica Sabbatical is a research expedition the company is running, and it is seeking volunteers to join environmental scientist Kirstie Jones-Williams to investigate the presence of microplastics on the continent.

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Crown staff strike?

CROWN Casino workers are threatening to refuse alcohol service during Melbourne's Spring Racing Carnival, or even walk off the job as part of strike action.

The union has applied to the Fair Work Commission to allow for a ballot of its members to endorse action, with the warnings coming in the midst of struggles between the casino and the union over a new enterprise bargaining agreement.

The ballot is targeted to be finished before 28 Oct with strikes planned to commence by 01 Nov.

The union has rejected Crown's offer of a 2.5% annual wage increase over the next three years, and is demanding 5% over the same period, as well as increased job security.







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Aus immune to Brexit



VISITATION to Britain is feeling the pinch from Europe thanks to Brexit, but Australian numbers remain strong, VisitBritain Director Asia Pacific. Middle East & Africa Tricia Warwick said.

Speaking at the tourism board's "Find Your Great Britain" event in Sydney last night, Warwick told TD VisitBritain's research found geographical distance had insulated Australia from the harshest effects of Brexit.

"The closer you are to the UK, the more affected you feel, and the more you're concerned," Warwick said.

"Numbers-wise, it hasn't affected us from Australia...

but Europe is down a couple of percent in the last few months.

"It's a period of uncertainty. so people are putting plans on hold...planning periods are longer from here, so people are less affected by that.

"We've got e-gates now for Australians which can speed you through, particularly at the main arteries like Heathrow, Gatwick and Manchester, which are the main Aussie gateways."
