Massive industry job cuts

THE Australian travel and tourism sector has reacted swiftly to the government-imposed restrictions tackling the COVID-19 outbreak, with thousands of industry workers to be out of a job this week.

Social media posts indicate hundreds of travel agency staff have been laid off in the last day or so, while several major retail agency groups are believed to have closed their doors to the public, only dealing with clients via email or phone as staff are put on heavily reduced hours.

Qantas has stood down about 20,000 staff as it grounds its international fleet, and Corporate Travel Management this morning confirmed it was targeting cost reductions of at least \$10 million per month, involving some staff redundancies.

have both been suspended from trading, with reports in mainstream media yesterday indicating Webjet was seeking to raise \$150 million but was unable to find backing "at any price".

Tour operators, reeling from border closures and other impacts to operations, are being forced to lay off staff, while thousands of small and medium travel and tourism businesses are facing a catastrophic cash flow crisis.

SLK makes changes

SEALINK Travel Group has suspended its FY2020 earnings guidance as it cuts costs across its tourism-related businesses.

These changes include the suspension of sightseeing cruise operations on Sydney Harbour and the Murray River in SA, as well as scaling back some touring and marine services.

THE organisers of Germany's once-in-a-decade Oberammergau 2020 event will not take place amid the coronavirus outbreak.

Oberammergau off

It's only the third time the massive tourist drawcard has been deferred since 1633, with officials now advising it will take place in two year's time.

"According to the current risk assessment, it is not possible to carry out the Oberammergau Passion Play," an official statement said.

Ironically the play was first performed in the 1600s as the community battled the plague, vowing to perform the play about the life of Jesus Christ every 10 years in perpetuity so that God would put an end to the disease.

Govt lends Air NZ \$900m

THE New Zealand Government will provide Air New Zealand a standby loan facility of up to NZ\$900m as it manages the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak and govt border restrictions.

The agreement will see Air New Zealand able to access the funding if its cash reserves drop below a minimal threshold, with the facility to be available to the airline for 24 months.

To be provided in two tranches, the \$600m will be an interest rate expected to be between \$7-8% per annum and the remaining \$300m will likely have a 9% per annum interest rate.

The rates will increase by 1% if Air New Zealand does not pay it off within 12 months.

Air New Zealand Chairman Therese Walsh said the airline was greatly appreciative of the

ACCC issues advice

THE ACCC has issued advice for businesses and consumers on their rights and obligations due to cancellation of flights, travel services or events due to the coronavirus pandemic, or if people wish to cancel their travel plans.

The body has also urged consumers to remain patient, and where possible to contact issues" - for more, CLICK HERE. Government's support.

"The loan facility ensures that Air New Zealand can continue to play a vital role in connecting New Zealanders and our businesses with each other here at home and around the world,"

The airline will only be able to access the money subject to meeting certain criteria, including agreeing to an operating finance plan with the Government and other conditions.

Air New Zealand also has to cancel the 2020 interim dividend of 11 cents per share (which equates to a total of \$123 million, which was announced on 27 Feb and was set to be paid to all shareholders on 25 Mar.

Under the agreement Air New Zealand is also prohibited from paying any dividends to shareholders while it is still owing on the loan.

MTA suspends fees

MOBILE Travel Agents (MTA) is suspending monthly membership fees for its advisors until 30 Jun.

The suspension will be reviewed at the end of the financial year.

MEANWHILE, MTAs Alycia Papadopoulos and Travelust's Kirsty Thomas-Thoeun have prepared a letter to Members of Parliament to highlight sole traders being left out of the first Government stimulus package.

NEW Zealand has closed its borders to all non-New Zealand residents in an effort to contain the spread of COVID-19.

"At no time in New Zealand's history has a power like this been used, and I recognise how extraordinary it is," Prime Minster Jacinda Ardern conceded.

The ban came into effect from midnight yesterday.

NEW Caledonia is preparing to cease all commercial flights, with the exception of those directly linking it to metropolitan France.

Smartraveller has advised those wishing to depart the country to do so at the earliest opportunity.

Although the Australian Government advises against all international travel, those who do travel to New Caledonia will have to undergo a mandatory 14-day self-isolation period.

Rex reduces flts

REGIONAL Express (Rex) has announced reductions to its network, which will take effect from 06 Apr.

The downscale will see the airline reduce capacity by 45%, and includes the suspension of Adelaide-Port Augusta, Sydney-Armidale and Sydney-Newcastle.

The changes come with Rex appealing to the state governments for assistance "to give the regional carriers a fighting chance of seeing through the current crisis".

The airline is calling for State Governments to divert a portion of their budgets for regional airport infrastructure to help out regional carriers and urged them to follow the Federal Government by waiving fees and taxes.

THE US Department of State & Bureau of Consular Affairs has issued a global level 4 health advisory, "do not travel".

The edict advises United States citizens to avoid all international travel due to COVID-19.
