"Gap year at home" push

AUSTRALIAN young people about to graduate from Year 12 and university may be urged to take a gap year at home in 2021, as a way of filling gaps in the Working Holiday Maker (WHM) program due to COVID-19.

Border closures mean there are currently only about half of the usual 150,000 foreign young people taking advantage of the scheme, putting severe pressure on Australia's agricultural, healthcare and tourism sectors.

The 'Have a Gap Year at Home' plan is a recommendation from the Federal Parliament's Joint Standing Committee on Migration which has been undertaking an inquiry into the WHM program.

The Committee said the initiative should appeal to young Aussies' patriotism and sense of adventure, enabling them to see their own country and earn money along the way, with consideration to also be given

TRAVEL advisors wanting to boost their expertise on Malaysia and Malaysia Airlines can try their hand at the new Malaysia Travel Expert platform - see the last page. to a HECS/HELP discount for undertaking the work.

The Committee has also urged the government to enable WHM workers to stay on JobSeeker payments for the next 12 months while undertaking low paid agricultural work, as well as a one-off payment to help with travel and accommodation costs.

Amendments to the existing WHM visa are also recommended including enabling any visitor working in key industries in some areas to count this towards qualifying for a second and/ or third year visa, and allowing backpackers to work for the same employer for over six months.

It's also suggested that current WHM visa holders who have had to leave the country be given priority for any reapplications, extend age limits for current visa holders, and consider a sponsorship program requiring peak bodies, businesses or governments to help sponsor quarantine arrangements for Working Holiday Makers.

Carnival ships out

CARNIVAL Corporation has confirmed it now expects to sell or otherwise dispose of a total of 18 of its older ships as it deals with the COVID-19 pandemic.

The company reported a US\$1.7 billion loss for the three months to 31 Aug - more details in today's issue of Cruise Weekly.

CCL extends pause

CARNIVAL Cruise Line this morning announced a further extension of its ongoing suspension of cruise operations in Australian waters.

The latest update sees the cancellation of Carnival Splendor departures up to and including 07 Jan 2021, while Carnival Spirit cruises are being suspended right through until 16 May next year.

At this stage there's been no update from sister brand P&O Cruises Australia.

Return pax boost

THE Federal Govt has proposed plans to raise the number of Aussies returning from overseas from 4,000 to 6,000 a week.

The government revealed today it would now write to state and territory leaders to work out specific passenger numbers.

Intrepid's fam affair

INTREPID Travel has launched new retreats for parents and kids as family travel booms.

The company has created four new retreat-style tours in England, Morocco and Turkey, with safety and quality as top priorities - CLICK HERE to view.

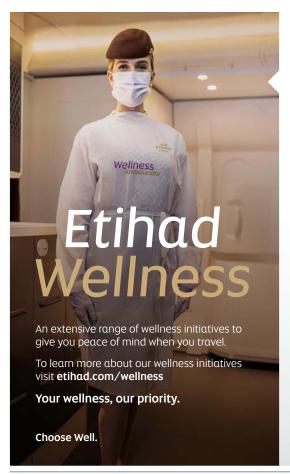

SIA shuts CBR, WLG

SINGAPORE Airlines has today announced the closure of its stations in Canberra and Wellington as well as Stockholm and Dusseldorf as part of a review of its network due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

During Aug the carrier operated a "skeletal" network of flights to just 28 cities, reflecting a 90.5% decline in capacity compared to

Expedia TAAP Marriott deal

EXPEDIA Group is now offering dedicated B2B rates for Marriott properties across the globe via the Expedia Travel Agent Affiliate Program (TAAP) platform.

The move is a consequence of the wholesale distribution deal between Expedia and Marriott 12 months ago (*TD* 18 Sep 2019), meaning agents using the platform automatically have access to higher margin rates from Marriott.

The special B2B rates will appear in the platform like any other Expedia TAAP pricing, with the agreement also meaning tour

SA opens up ACT

THE South Australian Government is now allowing travel to happen across its border with residents from the ACT, with the policy coming into effect from midnight this morning.

Travel from the ACT to SA will no longer require a 14-day quarantine period, however, the state stopped short of approving the same policy for NSW.

The state's Premier Steven
Marshall had hinted earlier this
week that restrictions to NSW
may be lifted soon, but according
to SA Police Commissioner Grant
Stevens that will only happen
when cases decrease further.

"We're hopeful the situation in NSW will continue to improve ... but for the time being people travelling from the ACT, they must travel by air straight from the ACT and not through NSW," he said.

THE easing of restrictions in New Zealand has seen Jetstar announce the recommencement of its domestic operations in the country from tomorrow.

This week NZ Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern confirmed the relaxation of previous rules which now allow airlines to utilise the middle seat (**TD** 14 Sep).

JQ has been out of the sky in NZ for the last four weeks, and will now resume services on six key routes with mandatory masks and other COVID measures in place.

DL loyal to raising

DELTA Air Lines has revealed plans to raise US\$6.5 billion using its loyalty program as collateral.

The airline will sell senior secured notes backed by its SkyMiles program, with money raised to be used for general corporate purposes and to improve its liquidity position.

Luxury appetites

CLOSE to a third of Small Luxury Hotels of the World's 6,000 Invited members have indicated they are currently planning a luxury trip in 2021, according to a new survey compiled by the independent hotel group.

Only 6% of respondents said they would reduce spending on short breaks over the next 12 months, with holidays ranking above other personal purchases such as clothes, electronics, furniture and fine dining.

Close to 42% of Oceania-based members flagged they were keen to take a luxury domestic trip, while 17% globally indicated they would take a staycation in the fourth quarter of 2020.

Rex up for regional

REGIONAL Express has reinforced its intentions to stand up for the "abandoned" regional communities of Australia following the withdrawal of Virgin Australia on eight routes.

"These communities are concerned about their future as they face the prospect of being left with Qantas as the sole monopoly provider, especially at a time when their regional economies have been devastated by the COVID-19 pandemic, bushfires and drought," the carrier's GM for Network Strategy Warrick Lodge said.

"When Virgin Australia withdrew from the monopoly routes of Perth-Esperance and Perth-Albany in 2016 due to heavy losses on these routes, the WA Government turned to Rex to pick up the pieces," he added.

AQUARIUS International Development has commenced rolling out a five-year, US\$250 million tourist expansion plan in South East Asia, encompassing luxury resorts, yacht charters, premium gourmet and dining venues and online travel booking and membership services.

The first two projects to open in the coming months are a pair of luxury Thai resorts in Koh Chang and Koh Man in Thailand.

EU extends waiver

THE European Commission has agreed to an extension of the slot rule waiver until the end of the 2020-21 winter season.

The 80/20 rule, that requires airlines to use slots at least 80% of the time was waived for the first time in Mar (TD 16 Mar).

The announcement came as air traffic manager EUROCONTROL said it unfortunately expects the total flights in Europe to be down 55% for the year.

Sydney's Luna Park turns 85



CATO backs border opening call

THE Council of Australian Tour Operators (CATO) has added its voice to the chorus of industry groups calling for the urgent reopening of domestic borders.

This week heavyweights including Flight Centre, Qantas, Helloworld and Virgin Australia have been undertaking a round of mainstream media interviews highlighting the devastating impact of the closures which are still in place despite low or nil infection rates.

CATO MD Brett Jardine said many of the organisation's 120 members had created domestic programs when international borders were closed.

"Many of these programs are now being re-assessed and cancelled due to unnecessary domestic border closures, putting even further financial pressure on travel businesses and impacting their ability to save jobs," he said.

CATO is also calling for travel bubbles with nearby countries with similar low infection rates.

LUNA Park Sydney will celebrate its 85th year on 04 Oct, with the venerable attraction hosting a big birthday bash right through the upcoming school holidays.

Having reopened in Jul. Luna Park (pictured) is currently operating on weekends (and daily during school holidays) with COVID-safe procedures in place including a cashless environment and a requirement to prepurchase tickets online, including a \$50 flat rate unlimited ride pass - see lunaparksydney.com.

Parrtjima 2021

PARRTJIMA, which kicked off last week, will return to Alice Springs in 2021 from 09-18 Apr.

The 10-day festival commenced with a welcome to country at Alice Springs Desert Park and continued with music by Stuart Nuggett, the first of the Deep Listening talks with journalist Tracey Holmes, and a showing of the film Babakiueria.

This year's Parrtjima was moved from 03-12 Apr to 11-15 Sep due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
