

# **AVMIN** expands its tech

**FLIGHT** Centre-owned charter aircraft company AVMIN has launched a new booking platform called JetBidders to meet rising demand for charter flights.

The new request & bid management platform aims to streamline the booking process by making an enquiry, comparing costs and managing requests faster and easier.

Jetbidders has been fast-tracked in response to rising need, with AVMIN witnessing a 200% increase in demand for charter flights compared to prior to the pandemic.

AVMIN Managing Director Paul O'Brien said the new JetBidders' platform allowed clients to source the right aircraft for their specific needs far more easily.

"Clients can enter in the details of where they need to go, number of passengers, reasons for flying and then every aircraft owner who sits in that category can bid on the job within seconds," he explained.

O'Brien said while the private charter industry continues to experience growth post-pandemic, technology ease-of-use for both consumers and aircraft operators was paramount.

"With the increase in charter flights across all sectors we support, we wanted to streamline the charter request and bid management process while broadening the reach of requests visible to aircraft owners and operators globally," he said.

"While private aviation has been considerably more resilient during the pandemic than commercial airline activity, we are determined to continue to innovate the industry with new technologies and concepts."

He added lockdowns across the country over the past 12 months saw a surge in booking requests, particularly from the sports industry, such as the National Rugby League and World Surf League, as well as mining, government, entertainment and medical clients.

"So far in 2021 we have conducted 187 flights in Jan, 166 in Feb and 395 flights in Mar alone," O'Brien said.

"During the height of the coronavirus pandemic our charter flight numbers surged due to the increasing number of contracts we were fulfilling to fly nurses, doctors and other health workers as well as police and patients around the country."

Another private jet charter platform, Aerocode, also revealed it is aspiring to fill the gaps in the private aviation market and bring transparency to the jet-booking process (*TD* 30 Mar).

# Globus chooses new path

**GLOBUS** Family of Brands has used the travel downturn to flesh out a brand new touring product that it believes is "unlike anything else in the market".

Recently speaking with *Travel* Daily, the company's Head of Sales, Peter Douglas, said its new Choice Touring by Globus product followed nine months of research which found that flexibility and choice were among the most important sought after qualities travellers wanted in a holiday.

"Travellers will have on average about nine total choices of excursion during the course of a tour and it really gives people the freedom not to have to stay in a large group the whole time, they can go off and do something that interests them and there are some pretty amazing experiences that we have included in there," Douglas said.

Initially available across 13

itineraries in Europe and North America starting from the end of the year through to 2022, the new suite of tours includes a nine-day in-depth adventure in Scotland from \$3.162pp. featuring a range of experiences such as whisky tastings, castle inspections and a lake cruise of Loch Lomond.

Further highlights include an eight-day Eastern Canada adventure offering bike tours of Kingston, a guided tour of Mont-Tremblant National Park, and wine tasting in Quebec.

Travellers can take as many excursions as they like at no extra cost, with Douglas confirming the Aussie market has so far reacted positively to the launch.

"The early signs are good...the interest is very high and on the back of vaccines that is probably going to really roll through to what we see as a really successful full 2022," he said.

#### **EK trials IATA Pass**

**EMIRATES** has commenced trialling the International Air Transport Association's (IATA) Travel Pass on select flights from Dubai to Barcelona and London Heathrow to Dubai.

The carrier has also indicated the trial will soon be expanded to other routes, with eligible passengers invited to download the app and enrol for the digital travel pass ahead of their travels.

"We are pleased to have been pioneers and partner with IATA in trialling this initiative in real time and soon will be launching other initiatives to further enhance our customer experience," said the airline's Chief Operating Officer Adel Al Redha.

Emirates hopes the trial will help to expedite the full rebound of its depleted traffic network, alongside its generous ticket validity which allows customers to hold or use tickets issued from 01 Apr on future travel for 24 months

Apparently this is the kind of educational material being supplied to kindergarten and grade one students in NSW that is coming under heavy scrutiny from parents, some of whom have labelled it Western Sydney Airport "propaganda".

The lesson plans released by the state's Department of Infrastructure encourages children to imagine they are on an advisory group in charge of addressing concerns from local community groups and residents about Sydney's upcoming aviation hub.

Work sheets also spruik the benefits of job creation and reduced road congestion.

### Rex's capital gain

THE first Regional Express flight from Sydney to Canberra touched down in the capital this morning, heralding a \$191 million annual injection for Canberra's economy.

Operating seven return flights Mon to Fri, Rex stated the launch means more competition on key Aussie routes and cheaper flights for consumers, with flights currently priced at \$99 one-way.

The service represents an extra 160,000 seats a year and the creation of more than 300 jobs.

#### Venus is delivered

VIKING has taken delivery of its newest ocean ship, Viking Venus, to be officially named in the United Kingdom next month.

The delivery ceremony took place at Fincantieri's shipyard in Ancona, with Venus to now make her way to the United Kingdom, where she will be named by her ceremonial godmother, respected British journalist and broadcaster Anne Diamond.

# And we have lift off!



THE first quarantine-free passenger flight from Australia to New Zealand took off from Sydney this morning bound for Auckland, marking the start of the trans-Tasman bubble.

Jetstar flight JQ201 touched down at 11.20am (9.20am AEST) today, where an official welcome party at Auckland Airport greeted the historic flight.

Qantas Group CEO Alan Joyce was on hand to personally farewell the first group of passengers at Sydney Airport, stating the two-way travel bubble marked a significant milestone for travel in both countries.

"Quarantine-free travel has been almost 400 days in the making, reopening these flights across the Tasman is a very important milestone in the recovery from the pandemic for Australia and New Zealand but also aviation & tourism," he said.

"New Zealand was Australia's second biggest source of international visitors before the pandemic - today, it's about to go straight to number one.

"We've seen strong demand since the bubble was announced. with tens of thousands of bookings made in the first few days," Joyce added.

The bubble has also seen a bookings spike across hotels and operators in destinations like Auckland and Wellington, as well as in Aussie cities like Brisbane, which has not had any in-bound flights from Christchurch and Wellington since 28 Mar 2020.

Since the announcement of the bubble, new research from Agoda has revealed a whopping 850% increase in searches by Australians looking for accommodation in New Zealand. and a 470% increase for Kiwis searching for trips to Australia.

### Crown \$3b injection

**CROWN** Resorts has received a voluntary, non-binding proposal from Oaktree Capital Management to provide the company with \$3 billion in structured funding.

The proposal, which has not yet been approved by Crown, would be used to buy back some or all Crown shares which are held by Consolidated Press Holdings.

## NT road campaign

TOURISM NT has launched a domestic marketing campaign aimed at increasing road trip travellers to the region, primarily targeting the 50+ market with a secondary focus on travellers aged between 25 and 49.

Deals from Expedia, Big 4, Nitmiluk Tours, Kakadu Tourism and various motorhome companies will be key highlights of the campaign.
