Holidays of Australia

NZ extends scheme

THE New Zealand Government has announced an extension of its Consumer Travel Reimbursement Scheme (*TD* 08 Sep 2020) for six months, through until 31 Dec.

The scheme pays NZ-based travel agents 7.5% of the value of all cash refunds they are able to successfully recover for their clients, or 5% of the value of any credits secured or rebooked for international travel.

So far it has supported travel agencies and wholesalers to recoup NZ\$245m in refunds and \$190m in credits, with about \$20 million remaining in the \$47.2m funding pool for the scheme.

Emirates to Malta

EMIRATES will resume operations to Malta from 14 Jul, with a new thrice weekly service operating via Larnaca in Cyprus.

Malta reopened to tourists from the UAE on 01 Jun, with the boost lifting EK's European network to 34 destinations.

More lockdown impact

Australian consumer spend on travel: News Corp Australia Index

CLOSING down Australia's second most populated state continues to smash the travel industry, with this week's consumer travel spending figures from News Corp seeing drops across every sector.

Vic was shut down for the entire week of 31 May, and overall spending dropped three points to sit at -54% - the lowest level since late Feb when the market began its path to recovery.

The biggest drop was in the Airline Spend under \$500 category, which plummeted 11 points and is now sitting at a three month low of -43%.

Cruise crashed nine points and is now sitting at -75%, while the Bricks and Mortar travel agency category continued its gradual decline and is now at -85%.

Next week's figures will include another four days of the lockdown followed by the 25km travel restriction for metro Melbourne which will have heavily hit Vic regional tourism.

News Corp Head of Travel, Dwayne Birtles, is now predicting a start to recovery in Jul.

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Sabre GOPASS deal

SABRE Corporation has partnered with travel risk management platform GOPASS Global to help deliver biosecurity risk assessment capabilities to the global travel sector.

Integrated with Sabre's shopping APIs, GOPASS uses advanced analytics to provide a "quantifiable risk score" alongside each travel option, displaying the details to travel agents who are then able to better advise their clients on safe travel.

GOPASS Global CEO Mark Radford said the platform was powered by machine learning and artificial intelligence, giving travellers an end-to-end analysis of all aspects of their trip including arrival and exit restrictions, flight routes and transit, airports, airline, aircraft type, seat class and travel advice.

GOPASS also considers country conditions such as infection rates, government policy and data reliability, Sabre said. **TUCAN** Travel's liquidator now expects any payout to unsecured creditors to be about 10c in the dollar, with payments forecast to flow in mid to late Sep this year.

The tour operator, which ceased trading early this year (**TD** 03 Feb) owes just over \$780,000 to travel agents and their clients in Australia and New Zealand, but the collapse is further complicated by the company's intellectual property being "heavily intermingled" with that of its parent, Tucan UK, which is also no longer in operation.

Administrator Andrew Barnden from Rodgers Reidy last week issued a Statutory Report to Creditors in relation to Tucan's liquidation, which was voted on at a meeting held on 09 Mar.

The wind-up of the company saw Barnden named as liquidator, with this month's report confirming the collapse was due to the closure of international borders and an inability to provide full refunds.

Liquidation plan for Tucan

The liquidator continues to pursue a possible sale of intellectual property such as customer databases after receiving several enquiries, but Barnden said this required liaison with Tucan UK's administrators who had not provided him with any details regarding the valuation of the assets or any offers received in respect to the sale of the business.

Barnden said he had so far received 87 proofs of debt totalling \$499,659, while Tucan Travel Pty Ltd also acted as a guarantor for Tucan UK in respect to its bonding policy with ABTA and the UK Civil Aviation Authority's ATOL scheme.

The external administration has been so far estimated as costing \$136,000, with Barnden saying he expects the liquidation process to be completed in 6-12 months.

NZ bubble surge

OVERSEAS visitor arrivals to Australia leapt 172% in Apr, according to new figures from the Australian Bureau of Statistics which reflect the introduction of the quarantine-free travel bubble with New Zealand halfway through the month.

There were a total of 22,610 trips by foreign travellers during the month, while Australian resident returns from overseas increased 83.6% to 16,990 trips.

However Apr visitor arrivals were down 96.8% when compared with pre-COVID levels in Apr 2019.

New Zealand was the largest source country, accounting for 72% of all foreign arrivals into Australia during the month.

There were a total of 16,990 short term trips recorded by Australian residents returning from overseas, a decrease of 60 compared with Apr 2020 and down 98.1% on the pre-pandemic levels in Apr 2019.

The pact will see Travelport migrate its global platform to AWS with the aim of creating a "simpler, smarter and better future for travel retailing".

SAA going private

THE South African Government has sold a 51% majority stake in South African Airways to an investor group, meaning no more taxpayer bailouts will be required.

SAA's operations have been mothballed since Sep last year, with the new equity partner, named Takatso, planning to relaunch flights as soon as possible - starting with domestic and then regional destinations followed by "carefully selected" international long-haul routes.

Takatso said it plans to eventually publicly list the carrier.

ATCC plots training review



THE Australian Travel Careers Council (ATCC) has announced a "rigorous review" of all travel and tourism related qualifications, with a view to ensuring the industry is able to deal with new challenges arising in the postpandemic future.

ATCC CEO Rick Myatt, who's **pictured** during a recent meeting with Federal Communications, Urban Infrastructure, Cities and the Arts Minister Paul Fletcher to discuss the travel sector's current situation, said the review would be undertaken in partnership with the industry, as it develops new critical skills.

Myatt also confirmed plans to introduce a new formally structured training initiative focusing on network and cyber security risks and threats.

The program will be developed as a non-technical unit for practical, operational purposes focusing both on learners within educational institutions as well as people in the travel and tourism workforce already.

A fundamental awareness

of the subject matter will be included in the current SITTIND001 curriculum ranging from high school to Certificate III students, while a higher tier will be structured as a freestanding elective unit for industry supervisors and managers.

It will provide a "comprehensive knowledge of understanding, preventing and operationally dealing with cyber security attacks," Myatt said.

"As digital communications have become increasingly part of our professional landscapes, training for an awareness of risks at all levels of the workforce and the critical skills on how to deal with new & emerging cyber security threats will possibly avoid customer service disruptions and creates safer organisations."

Myatt said the initiative would still need to go through several approval processes, including a broader industry consultation which will be held nationally over the next six months - for more details email rhnmyatt@ travelcareerscouncil.com.au.

Canada forecast

DESTINATION Canada has released an updated tourism forecast, with expectations that a possible reopening of international borders in the coming months will lead to a "burst of pent-up travel demand from immunised residents of countries with low case counts".
