Viking voyage rejig

VIKING Cruises has revised the itinerary of its 2022 World Cruise on the eve of departure, with Viking Star to operate on an eastbound itinerary from LA, rather than westward towards Australasia as originally planned.

CEO Torstein Hagen urged pax to stick with the "180° change of course", which were forced by the swift closure of Indian ports.

The revised 120-day trip will visit Mexico, Central and South America, the Mediterranean, the Red Sea and the Middle East.

Carnival cancels

CARNIVAL Cruise Line has been forced to once again extend its pause in Australian operations, this morning advising the cancellation of *Carnival Splendor* sailings through to and including 26 Apr, and voyages on *Carnival Spirit* through to 28 Apr.

The "book by deadline" for clients who have a Future Cruise Credit valid through until 31 Mar has now been extended to a new book by date of 31 May this year.

Users must set up or use a Digital Identity to prove who they are online, meaning the app is secure and is a sufficient form of identification to enter certain venues and events.

Jetstar to Phuket

JETSTAR'S first flights to Thailand since the onset of the pandemic take off this week, with a Sydney-Phuket departure today and Melbourne-Phuket tomorrow.

The 787-8 services are an important milestone in the recovery of low-cost international leisure travel, according to Jetstar CEO Gareth Evans.



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Thai Airways ups comm

AFTER eliminating travel agent base commission in the first few months of the COVID-19 pandemic (*TD* 03 Jul 2020), Thai Airways International has now backflipped and will once again remunerate agencies for selling its fares to their customers.

The carrier, which is continuing to work through a "business rehabilitation" plan after filing for bankruptcy protection in May 2020, yesterday advised some of its industry partners of the welcome return of commission.

"We are pleased to advise effective for all tickets issued on/after 14 Jan until further notice, Thai Airways International will revise BSP standard base commission from zero percent (0%) to three percent (3%)."

Interestingly the move applies to all TG published fare types, including domestic travel within Thailand, as well as for international travel.

Thai's commission move bucks the trend of other carriers such as Qantas and Emirates which are persevering with their commission reductions effective from 01 Jul this year.

Thai's restructuring process has seen it undertake significant costcutting efforts, including reducing its Australian workforce by almost 50% (**TD** 20 Oct 2021), with the departures including Marketing Manager Sue Marr last month after more than 19 years.

VS to fly to Austin

VIRGIN Atlantic has announced the launch of a new seasonal non-stop route between London Heathrow and Austin in Texas.

Four weekly Boeing 787-9 flights will operate between the cities from 25 May, with Austin to become VS's 11th USA port. How has the pandemic impacted the way the travel sector operates, and what will remain in the emerging postcovid world? Cruise discrimination

THE Australian cruise sector is being unfairly treated by Australian governments when compared to most land-based industries, CLIA Australasia MD Joel Katz believes.

"It's time governments recognised that cruising has gone above and beyond most other sectors during this pandemic, and ended the different treatment that hurts travel industry professionals so deeply," Katz pleaded this morning.

"No setting is immune from COVID-19 and we are indeed seeing cases being detected on cruise ships...the difference however is that cruise ships are subject to stringent science-based measures that include testing and vaccination requirements before boarding...this isn't true in your local shops, pubs, theatres or most other land-based settings, and it's now clear the incidence of COVID-19 is far lower on cruise ships than it is on land."

Airport closures?

AUSTRALIAN Airports Association Chief Executive Officer James Goodwin has warned that rising staff shortages caused by the Omicron wave could lead to Australian airports closing down or entering only partial operation.

The comments follow Virgin Australia's decision to cut its capacity by 25% yesterday (*TD* 11 Jan), driven partly by many of its staff forced into isolation.

Shipyard looks sunk

A FAILURE to reach a financial arrangement between the German Government and Genting Hong Kong has seen the cruise/ resort company's shipbuilder MV Werften file for bankruptcy, according to German reports.

The move casts doubt on the future of Genting's *Global Dream* vessel which is currently under construction at the shipyard - more details in today's *CW*.



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SA pleads its case

THE Tourism Industry Council South Australia (TiCSA) has compiled a list of key areas of support needed for the state's decimated tourism sector, calling for \$81 million a year for the next three years from the SA Govt to make it a reality.

Under the proposed rescue package, funds would be used for business restart opportunities, to drive tourism demand, create new infrastructure, enhance staff training options, and increase partnership and collaborations.

"Recovery is not 'business as usual' and cannot simply occur with the flick of a switch, ongoing support is necessary for the tourism and hospitality industries, which are the lifeblood of our state, to restart and reinvest," TiCSA CEO Shaun de Bruyn said.

"As the country transitions... into economic recovery and eventually, focuses our attention back to growth, our tourism industry needs govt support."

Germany labels Australia "high risk"

GERMANY has added nearly 40 countries to its COVID 'high risk' list, including Australia.

Travellers who have been in a high risk area will need to fill out a Digital Registration of Entry **HERE**, as well as provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test, recovery or a vaccination pass before arriving in Germany.



AUSTRALIANS are very proud of their beaches - which means we may be upset to learn there are no candidates in the top 10 of a recent study identifying the best beach vacation destinations in the world.

The study looked at 100 beaches around the globe and ranked them on factors such as weather, sea temperature, hotel prices, number of restaurants, and social media value.

Copacabana topped the list, with well over 10,000 nearby restaurants & bars, and an average sea temperature of 23.6 degrees.

Joining the Rio de Janeirobased balneairo in the top 10 is Miami Beach, Venice Beach, South Beach, Santa Monica State Beach, Naama Bay, Barbuda Pink Sand Beach, La Barceloneta, Mui Ne, and Cayo Coco, but for the record, Australia's highest-ranking beach was Bondi, which finished just outside in 12th place.

More family appeal

VAIL Resorts' Beaver Creek Resort in Colorado has opened a new family-friendly beginner and intermediate learning terrain area in the ski park called McCoy Park.

The 250-acre area features 17 trails served by two new lifts, while still maintaining its existing snowshoe & cross-country areas.

"We are thrilled to add this terrain to our mountain, McCoy Park offers families the opportunity to explore together and immerse themselves in nature," Beaver Creek COO Nadia Guerriero said.

In addition to the new family area, Beaver Creek has also invested heavily in high-speed lifts across the resort, including to Peak 7 in Breckenridge and larger six-person lifts at Okemo.



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Sydney hotel high

SYDNEY'S hotel industry enjoyed its best performance since the start of the pandemic in Dec, according to data from STR.

Occupancy reached 45% for the month, while the average daily rate (ADR) was recorded at \$236.64 and the revenue per available room was \$106.38.

Despite the short-term rally, the numbers were still short of where Sydney was before the pandemic, with ADR for example previously at \$651.85 in Dec 2019.

KLM's SAF pledge

KLM has announced that it is adding a small cost to its air tickets in order to boost its broader commitment to sustainable aviation fuel (SAF).

The airline is adding between €1 and €4 for Economy class tickets and between €1.50 and €12 for Business class tickets.

KLM has slated the target of using 10% SAF by 2030, however has conceded it needs to accelerate the plan from its current 1% base to meet the goal.

UK massive job void

CLOSE to a quarter of a million travel and tourism jobs will remain unfilled in the United Kingdom by the end of the year, new analysis conducted by the World Travel & Tourism Council (WTTC) predicts.

The data shows the UK is anticipated to see a shortfall of around 12%, representing a staggering one in eight job vacancies left unfilled.

WTTC has also warned that reinstating damaging travel restrictions, such as the recent measures aimed at curbing the spread of new variants, do not stop the spread of the virus and only damage livelihoods. GRANDPLACE
