
EK retrofits A380s

EMIRATES has deployed the first of 120 Airbus A380s to be fully revamped, with the launch aircraft, designated as A6-EVM, operating on 06 Jan on the Dubai-London Heathrow route.

The massive US\$2 billion retrofit program will see EK's latest products and interiors installed in all cabins, including 56 Premium Economy seats on the main deck, plus new leather upholstery and finishings with a lighter colour palette in First and Business class on the upper deck.

All the work was designed, conducted and completed inhouse at EK's Dubai facilities, with the massive project expected to be completed in 2025 - including refits of Emirates' Boeing 777s.

TravelManagers magic millions

TRAVELMANAGERS Australia has reported a record-breaking Dec, with the company's Finance & Commercial Manager, Tanyu Cilek, saying the number of members on track for at least \$1 million in sales this financial year had tripled since 2019.

The strong growth trend has seen the average growth recorded by TravelManagers advisors surging to 86% when compared to pre-pandemic sales in Dec 2019, as part of a long running growth trend which has seen members growing 52% on average versus the equivalent six month period three years ago.

"These PTMs are achieving leisure sales results at a level that would more commonly be seen in corporate, call centre situations," Cilek suggested.

He said the group was seeing a strong trend towards highvalue holidays, both domestic and international, with sales

NZ to axe paper declarations

VISITORS to NZ will no longer be required to complete paperbased incoming passenger cards from later this year, with the Government confirming that the online NZ Traveller Declaration will be reintroduced in mid-2023.

The electronic system was introduced as a temporary measure during the COVID-19 pandemic, allowing visitors to provide details of vaccination status as part of procedures to safely reopen the NZ border, but was shut down on 20 Oct 2022.

A project to launch the updated declaration form from 01 Jul is being overseen by four NZ Government agencies - the Ministry of Health, Immigration New Zealand, Biosecurity New Zealand and NZ Customs.

A pilot of the system is planned for Apr-Jun, with officials working with airlines and airport partners to smooth its introduction.

for Europe up 45% and South America increasing 55%.

Domestic sales are also up almost 60% across the group, with Cilek saying there was also strong evidence to support a resurgence in the perceived value of the travel agent, with significant sales increases in every segment.

Air sales are up 64%, while land product has increased 46% and insurance has risen 46%, he said.

"We are delighted to be entering 2023 in such a strong position and look forward to seeing our Personal Travel Managers reap the rewards of so much hard work and dedication over the past three years," he concluded.

AA, BA boost pact

AMERICAN Airlines and British Airways will expand their cooperation on transatlantic and European flights over the upcoming Northern summer 2023 season.

The codeshare partnership will now see the AA code added to additional British Airways flights to and from London, including LHR to Cincinatti, Corfu, Dubrovnik, Faro, Mykonos, Split and Thira.

AA will also codeshare on BA flights from London Gatwick to Las Vegas, according to travel agent GDS screens.

Vietjet coming to MEL

LOW-COST Vietnamese carrier VietJet has announced it will begin operating flights from Melbourne Airport (MEL) in Apr.

The airline will initially run three return flights per week between Melbourne and Ho Chi Minh City using Airbus A330 aircraft, with the route expected to operate daily by Dec 2024.

Vietjet's arrival at MEL will also enhance connectivity to other destinations, by offering low-cost onward flight options via Ho Chi Minh City to countries including India, Japan and South Korea.

"We are thrilled to welcome Vietjet to Melbourne for the first time, and to be part of their plans for expansion in Australia," Melbourne Airport CEO Lorie Argus said this morning.

"Vietnam is both a really popular destination and an important source market, and the addition of Vietjet increases total Vietnam seat capacity this year to 153% of what it was pre-COVID.

"Services will offer an evening departure from Melbourne, allowing travellers to land in Ho Chi Minh in the morning, providing seamless connections to domestic destinations or facilitating a day of business in Vietnam," Argus added.

The new service will also help connect Victorian residents who were born in Vietnam to family and friends back home, in addition to providing another option for Vietnamese international students to travel to Australia for study.

Mercure CNS open

ACCOR has unveiled its newest hotel in Tropical North Queensland with the opening of Mercure Cairns.

Located two blocks from he Esplanade and across the road from Cairns Aquarium, the property was rebranded from ibis Styles Cairns, and underwent a multi-million dollar upgrade.

The hotel features 75 guestrooms, including Loft Spa Room and Executive King Room categories, a pool deck, and a new restaurant, The Stanley, which serves a modern Australian menu of fresh and local produce.

Tourism Ireland chief resigns

TOURISM Ireland's Chief Executive, Niall Gibbons, has announced he will step down from the role in Apr.

Gibbons has worked for the national tourism marketing organisation for 21 years, initially as Director of Corporate Services from 2002-2009, followed by nearly 14 years at the helm.

In a statement posted to LinkedIn last night, Gibbons described being CEO of Tourism Ireland as "an honour and a privilege", adding "the time is right for a new challenge".

The announcement coincides with the lead-up to the 25th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement, which gave rise to Tourism Ireland.

Thailand backflip

AUTHORITIES in Thailand have issued a further clarification about the country's vaccination requirements, now advising that the eased protocols introduced in Oct continue to apply.

Earlier this week Government statements indicated that incoming passengers were required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 (*TD* 09 Jan).

However an update from the Tourism Authority of Thailand yesterday confirmed that "international travellers arriving in Thailand are not required to show proof of vaccination".

Negative test results are also not mandated - but the country's Minister for Health, Anutin Charnivakul noted that while Thailand is welcoming all visitors, "a visitor source market may require incoming visitors, including their own nationals returning home, to have a negative PCR result".

In addition passengers who have such a requirement from their home country - currently including India and China - must have health insurance covering COVID-19 treatment in Thailand.

THREE new Northlander trainsets will soon be on the rails between Toronto and Northern Ontario in Canada, but first, they're being stuck in the freezer - literally.

In Ontario's northern region, where winters are bitterly cold, the new carriages and engines purchased by the provincial government are being put to the test in an indoor climate chamber to see how they will perform in the razor-sharp winter climate.

The indoor research centre in Ottawa is equipped to simulate intense heat or cold, wind and ice, to see what conditions impact the equipment the most.

After further testing the new trainsets are hoped to be in service in the coming years.

Jayride riding high in '23

ASX-LISTED global airport transfers marketplace Javride Limited today updated investors. saving it has seen a record high number of passenger trips booked during the second quarter of the 2023 financial year.

The 153,000 bookings made between Oct and Dec 2022 represents a 198% increase on the same period 12 months prior, generating a net revenue of \$1.13 million - up 186% year-on-year.

The company also smashed records for the first half of this financial year, with a total of 294,000 passenger trips booked and \$2.38 million net revenue generated.

These results exceeded its prepandemic performance, which sat at an all-time high of 235,100 bookings and \$2.37 million in net revenue for 1H FY20.

Although the marketplace saw a 35% decline in European trip volumes during Q2 due to

expected seasonality, Asian trip volumes increased more than tenfold following the reopening of key destinations like Japan.

"It is encouraging to see our new growth initiatives are beginning to deliver positive results," Jayride Managing Director Rod Bishop said.

"We are sharply focused on continuing to deliver on our strategy to become the world leader in rides for travellers, and accelerate our path to cash flow positive in the coming quarters".

Jayride also hinted at a number of new initiatives in the pipeline ahead of Europe summer in Q4 FY23, such as product launches and new partnerships including with several low-cost and traditional carriers via CarTrawler.

Wizz's Cardiff cut

EUROPEAN low-cost carrier Wizz Air will permanently shut down its base in Cardiff from 25 Jan due to high operational costs, after being situated in the Welsh capital for less than a year.

The airline will continue to operate at eight UK airports, with a network of 120 routes.

Oman Air to Russia

OMAN Air is now operating to Moscow's Sheremetyevo Airport (SVO), with the carrier offering fares from Australia in combination with Malaysia Airlines, Thai and Batik Air.

Former Crystal river ships sold to Riverside

GERMAN cruise startup Riverside Luxury Cruises has confirmed the acquisition of the remainder of the former Crystal River Cruises fleet, after previously also announcing the purchase of the *Crystal Mozart* (**CW** 06 Oct 2022).

Riverside Cruises is an offshoot of hotel group Seaside Collection, and plans to begin its first season on Europe's waterways in Apr this year.

Prior to its demise, the now defunct Crystal River Cruises constructed four identical ships, each with capacity for 106 passengers: the Crystal Bach, Crystal Mahler, Crystal Debussy and Crystal Ravel.

The near-new vessels are being renamed as *Riverside Bach*, *Riverside Debussy*,

Riverside Mahler and Riverside Ravel, with two to sail this year along with the double-width Riverside Mozart, and the full fleet slated to return to operation in 2024.

Riverside Luxury Cruises is aggressively targeting business in the USA, offering 21% commission to travel advisors on all 2023 departures as well as special industry rates.

Founder Gregor Gerlach said "we are thrilled by the expansion of our fleet to include these storied vessels".

"This acquisition allows us to expand our itinerary offerings, showcasing a level of space, personalised service and elegance not found with any other river cruise line," he enthused.

AC cans Doha route

AIR Canada has confirmed the cessation of scheduled flights between Toronto and Qatar next month, just over two years after they debuted in Dec 2020.

The Star Alliance carrier cited "commercial reasons" for the indefinite suspension.

Air Canada's Doha route also included a codeshare deal with Qatar Airways, with the pact at the time said to provide smooth connectivity to Asia, Africa and the Middle East.

BRISBANE Airport will welcome electrical and furniture retailer BSR Group to its Da Vinci educational and industrial precinct, as the tenant of a newbuild 5,600 square metre office and warehouse space.

VIKING'S newest ship, Viking Neptune, was celebrated on Sun in Los Angeles with a naming ceremony, which saw her receive a blessing from ceremonial godmother and retired NASA astronaut, aquanaut and artist, Nicole Stott.

During the ceremony, Stott used a historic Viking broad axe to cut a ribbon, triggering a bottle of Norwegian aquavit to break on the ship's hull.

Guests enjoyed performances from Sissel Kyrkjebø, a worldrenowned crossover soprano and godmother of the Viking Jupiter, as well as Norwegian violinist Tor Jaran Apold.

"The Viking Neptune is a ship named for both the furthest planet in our solar system and the god of the sea - and our newest Viking godmother, Nicole Stott, as a NASA astronaut and aquanaut, also has connections to space and the sea," Chairman of Viking, Torstein Hagen, said.

The 930-capacity ship departed for Honolulu after the ceremony,

and is currently sailing the 2022-2023 Viking World Cruise, a voyage from Fort Lauderdale to London that spans 138-days, 28 countries and 57 ports, with overnight stays in 11 cities.
