Princess Nth Euro

PRINCESS Cruises will ramp up its Northern Europe program in summer 2027, with the line to offer 48 voyages to 54 destinations across 18 countries from Apr through Aug.

Regal, Majestic, Sky, and Caribbean Princess will sail from homeports in Southampton, England; Copenhagen, Denmark; Reykjavik, Iceland; Helsinki, Finland; as well as Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

The lineup includes the 64-day 'Ultimate European Journey' and the 49-day 'Northern Europe Explorer', with both itineraries sailing roundtrip from Southampton or Copenhagen.

Sky's the limit for Peru

EXCLUSIVE

A **NEW** open skies agreement signed between Australia and Peru this week (**TD** 07 Jan) represents an "incredible opportunity" for outbound and inbound travel for both countries, according to Contours Travel director Heather Poppelier.

"Peru is a hugely popular destination for Australians travelling to South America, and is only growing," Poppelier told **TD**.

"Contours Travel experienced a 19% increase in passenger numbers to Peru from 2023/24 to 2024/25 and we are thrilled that



travel to Peru may soon be made even easier.

"We hope that the open skies agreement will encourage more Australians to consider Peru for the first time or return to uncover more of its wonders."

The agreement eliminates operational restrictions on where airlines can fly, how often, what aircraft can be used, and provides a clearer commercial runway to form codeshares with third-country carriers.

Presently there is no direct air link between Australia and Peru, with Qantas flying to Santiago from SYD/MEL and offering connecting flights via LATAM.

Aussies can also now connect to Argentina via AKL with MU, transferring to Peru from Buenos Aires (**TD** 18 Sep 2025). *AB/JB*

HA picks a date

HAWAIIAN Airlines has confirmed it will join the oneworld alliance in Apr, 10 months after confirming the switch was in the pipeline (**TD** 12 Mar 2025) following its merger with Alaska Airlines.

Travel is still the priority

TRAVEL is set to continue to be the biggest savings motivator for Aussies in 2026, according to new research from Money.com.au.

The nationally representative survey found that nearly half (46%) of Australians included saving for a holiday among their financial goals for 2026, making travel the most commonly cited budget priority for the second year in a row.

Squirrelling cash away for a holiday beat out other major saving priorities, including building an emergency fund (42%), saving for retirement (35%) and buying a home (26%).

“Most people can realistically plan for, budget toward and genuinely look forward to an overseas trip within a year, so it’s



no wonder it remains a strong priority for Australians, even as cost-of-living pressures continue,” said Money.com.au’s finance expert, Sean Callery.

“Our research shows that it takes Aussies, on average, about eight months to save for a holiday, which shows travel is something people are prepared to invest time and planning into.”

Callery also pointed out that travel experiences are increasingly being valued in the same way traditional milestones once were, particularly for the younger generations. *JM*

CCL focuses on Aus

CARNIVAL Cruise Line (CCL) remains unshaken in its commitment to local sailings, as other brands around the sector continue to emphasise fly-cruise.

Assistant vice president sales & marketing Anton Loeb told *Travel Daily’s* sister title *Cruise Weekly* these local sailings will continue to be its priority, as opposed to using them to promote more lucrative voyages overseas.

“If you look at our commitment here to this market and the team that’s set up here, this would be our key priority, to ensure we do well with the four ships that are based here,” he explained.

A Bangkok landmark

RADISSON Hotel Group has opened its new landmark property in Thailand, Radisson Hotel Chateau de Bangkok.

The 30-year-old building, located in one of Bangkok's most upscale districts, has been fully refreshed and rebranded to appeal to both business and leisure travellers.

Chateau de Bangkok features 178 guest rooms, three culinary concepts, flexible event spaces, fitness centre, spa room, and an outdoor pool.

The hotel's dining options include a coffee shop, a Thai-French fusion restaurant, and a rooftop bar.

Chateau de Bangkok is located 40 minutes from Suvarnabhumi Airport and 30 minutes from Don Mueang International.

Oceania goes kids-free

OCEANIA Cruises has formally transitioned to an adults-only luxury line, announcing overnight that bookings from 17 Jan now prohibit guests aged under 18 from boarding its ships.

The NCLH-owned brand has made clear that all existing reservations for children made prior to the cut-off date will be fully honoured, ensuring a seamless policy transition.

Oceania's rationale for making the shift is the pursuit of a more peaceful atmosphere on board after receiving feedback from its repeat customers.

"Our guests have consistently shared that the tranquil environment aboard our ships is one of the primary reasons they return time and time again," said Jason Montague, chief luxury officer for the cruise line.

"By transitioning to an adults-only experience, we are enhancing the very essence of the Oceania Cruises journey - one defined by sophistication, serenity and discovery."

In making the decision, Oceania also canvassed the opinions of experienced travel partners and new-to-brand guests, finding that people are seeking a "serene atmosphere, sophisticated service and unhurried pace" on board.

CA sells Cathay shares

AIR China is selling a portion of its shareholding in Cathay Pacific for HK\$1.3 billion (approximately A\$250 million).

Morgan Stanley is managing the divestment, with the 108 million shares sold amounting to around a 1.6% stake, expected to be completed this week.

The divestment reduces Air China's shareholding in Hong Kong's flag carrier from 28.7% to 27.1%, and is a precursor to Cathay's planned off-market share buyback of 643 million shares currently held by Qatar Airways Group.

Half-price Vietjet

VIETJET is offering 50% off base fares on flights between Australia and Vietnam from 13-15 Jan, by entering promo code VJKY when booking on the airline's website or mobile app.

The sale celebrates the carrier's partnership with Australian tennis tournament, Kooyong Classic 2026, which will also see Vietjet offer on-site promotions, fan activations and giveaways at its booth throughout the event.

Luft adopts Ama

LUFTHANSA Group has selected Amadeus as a key technology provider, with nine airlines from the group to adopt the software company's Nevio AI modular solutions.

Austrian Airlines, Brussels Airlines, Lufthansa, Swiss and more will use the tech to deliver better personalised offers to travellers, as well as to support more efficient operations.

Lufthansa Group is also expected to become the first airline group to adopt Amadeus Delivery Management, a key module that is designed to transform the traveller experience and flight operations, with capabilities such as fulfilment tracking.

Philo carrier presses pause

ROYAL Air Philippines has temporarily suspended all commercial flight operations.

While the Chinese-backed budget airline did not provide a reason for the decision, or specify when flights would resume, it said it was prioritising refunds.

The suspension mostly affects Taiwan's outbound travel market, as it cuts off the only direct air link between Taipei and Boracay, a small island in the Philippines.

"Thank you for your patience and understanding, we eagerly anticipate welcoming you aboard soon," the Philippines-based carrier stated on its website.



Initially a charter airline, Royal Air Philippines became a low-cost carrier in Dec 2019, and now operates seven routes.

The airline saw a steep decline in its two core source markets - travellers from mainland China and South Korea heading to Philippine resort destinations such as Boracay and Bohol.

Royal Air transported 51,800 international passengers in the first nine months of 2025, compared to 116,000 in 2024, while its domestic pax numbers plunged 63% year-on-year. *JM*

This is Fraser's House

THE Luxury Collection has introduced Frasers House in Singapore, marking the first property within the brand's portfolio in the state's city centre.

Set in the Bugis precinct, the hotel will offer 400 guest rooms following a phased transformation that aims to preserve its original Peranakan-inspired design heritage.

The property's existing collection of dining venues, which ranges from modern Cantonese to Western gastronomy, as well as its event spaces, will also undergo a complete refresh.



NCL trade rewards

NORWEGIAN Cruise Line (NCL) has launched a series of new trade initiatives to kick off its 2026 wave season.

The cruise line will scrap non-commissionable fares (NCFs) across all cruise fares, effective for sailings departing from 01 May, a move it said would put more revenue in agents' pockets.

NCL is also giving away one million Partners First Rewards points, including 200 to the first 1,500 agents to earn 100% on the line's wave quiz - register **HERE** for the wave webinar on 14 Jan to learn more.

Bali seeks a balance

AUTHORITIES in Bali have proposed a plan to require travellers to show bank statements before entering.

The concept has been mooted several times by the popular Aussie holiday spot, most recently touted last year by academic Ida Bagus Raka Suardana from the National Education Uni (**TD 07** Aug 2024).

Any move to interrogate the bank balance of visitors would be designed to ensure tourists positively contribute to the island's tourism sector and not encroach on the lives of locals.

"It is important to determine which foreign tourists are allowed to enter and which are not, so that visitors do not cause problems and instead contribute positively, particularly to the tourism sector," said Governor Wayan Koster.

Speaking to **Travel Daily**, David Beirman, senior lecturer at the University of Technology Sydney, explained the proposed move by Bali is not a unique concept, with countries such as the United Kingdom having similar procedures for "decades".

Beirman believes that the move is to target and deter younger and more vulnerable travellers.

"It appears that this measure targets younger tourists who treat Bali as a tropical 'schoolies' type destination/tropical pub," he said.

"Sadly there have been many instances of penniless visitors begging locals and other tourists for handouts." *JB*

Aussies stranded

A SMALL number of Australian tourists stranded on the remote desert island of Socotra in Yemen are receiving consular assistance from the Federal Government.

A state of emergency was declared on the island due to rising political tensions, leading to the closure of ports of entry, including Socotra's airport.

Flights are expected to resume soon but no date has been set.

DFAT advises against travelling to Socotra due to ongoing armed conflict and a very high threat of kidnapping and terrorism.

Winter travel havoc

EUROPE is facing widespread travel disruption this week due to deadly winter storms, which have brought heavy snow, ice and freezing temperatures.

Hundreds of flights were cancelled on Tue and train services were disrupted, leaving thousands of passengers stranded at major airports.

In northern and western France, six airports were temporarily shut down due to heavy snowfall, while the UK's John Lennon Airport in Liverpool was also forced to halt operations.

The Netherlands was similarly impacted, with Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport scrapping around 400 flight as crews worked to de-ice aircraft and clear runways.

Authorities have warned that the disruptions will continue, with more snow expected over the coming days.

MEETINGS, events, and hospitality technology provider Cvent has inked an agreement to acquire US-based ON24, an AI-powered platform for B2B enterprise sales and marketing.

The deal, worth around US\$400 million (A\$594m), will see ON24's secure enterprise-grade webinar and digital engagement capabilities, first party engagement data, and AI-powered workflows combined with Cvent's own event technology offerings.

The proposed transaction has been unanimously approved by the ON24 board of directors, and is expected to close in H1 2026, pending regulatory approvals.

Additionally, in what MCEC is declaring a first for any convention centre in Australia,



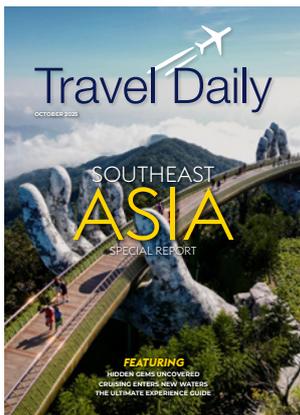

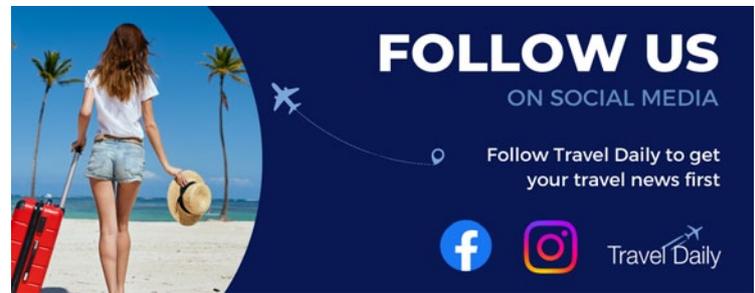

Dubai now out of contact

TRAVELLERS in Dubai will soon be able to enjoy a contactless hotel check-in system, allowing them to skip the front desk after completing a one-time digital and biometric registration.

The system, which is rolling out across all hotels in the emirate, means guests will be able to complete check-in formalities on smart phones prior to arrival.

For future stays, visitors would only need a quick authentication, such as facial recognition, to access their accommodations.

Developed by the Dubai Department of Economy and Tourism, the system enables guests to upload identification documents and biometric data one time only, with the information remaining securely stored and valid until the ID document expires.

The initiative is designed to offer more convenience and increase loyalty to the destination, particularly among repeat travellers, who make up a quarter of Dubai's visitors.

"By leveraging cutting-edge



solutions, we are not only enhancing the visitor journey, but also strategically positioning Dubai for sustained tourism growth," said Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, chairman of The Executive Council of Dubai.

The technology is designed to integrate easily into existing hotel apps and web platforms, minimising disruption for accommodation providers, and could potentially be extended to other parts of the visitor journey, such as car rentals. *JM*

EK recruits in Oz

EMIRATES has launched a recruitment drive in Australia to find engineers and technicians to assist with its expanding fleet and destination network.

Information road shows will take place in Sydney on 21 and 22 Jan, allowing for further insights into working with the airline for prospective employees.

Breaks on Vietnam

AUSSIE travellers are being warned that Vietnam does not recognise Australian drivers licences or International Driving Permits issued in Australia.

Visitors need a valid Vietnamese driving licence to drive or to ride a motorcycle of 50cc or more in Vietnam, or they may face fines.

The Kiwi is Calling

GREAT Journeys New Zealand has launched its earlybird sale, with 20% off multi-day rail tours.

The offer will run until 31 Jan and apply to rail tours departing between Sep 2026 and Apr 2027.

Tours provide dedicated guides, dining and activities across the entirety of New Zealand, ranging from rural alpine areas and coastal towns.
