## Inspiring unbeaten

## Ritzing up in Wolgan Valley

**EMIRATES** and Marriott International have inked a partnership to launch the new Emirates Wolgan Valley, a Ritz-Carlton Lodge in NSW.

The resort is set to be the first of its kind in the world, featuring 40 villas, each with private pools and bespoke amenities.

Emirates Wolgan Valley Ritz Carlton will open later this year, set on a 2,800-hectare conservancy most recently operated by One&Only Resorts (**TD** 30 Apr 2024); the property has been closed for 2.5 years due to access issues (**TD** 08 Jun 2023).

Once the resort reopens, guests will need to reach the property by helicopter, or a four-wheel drive service via the Donkey Steps.

Emirates is investing \$50 million in renovations, working in consultation with Marriott to transform the property, which the airline first opened over 15 years ago (**TD** 30 Oct 2009).

Design plans for Wolgan Valley Ritz Carlton's main homestead envision an arrival lounge and



sitting room, restaurant, lounge bar and wine room, with local produce, and a collection of local and international wines.

Plans also include a signature sleep-out experience: a guided journey into remote wilderness, with an evening meal outdoors and relaxation by a campfire.

Other renovated spaces will include an outdoor pool, tennis courts, equestrian stables, fitness centre, and The Ritz-Carlton Spa.

Marriott International VP APAC Rajeev Menon said that he is sure "there will be considerable interest" in opening more properties in Australia, with Wolgan Valley being "the first of many" in the country. *MS*

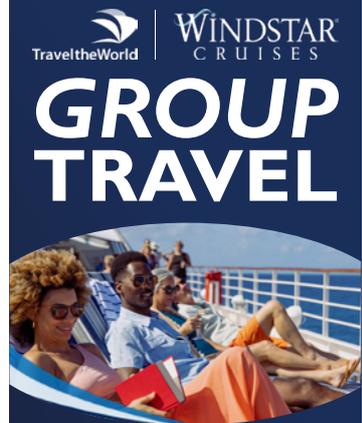

## ACCC fines car rental brand

### ECONOMY BOOKINGS

CAR rental platform EconomyBookings has paid an almost \$40,000 penalty over concerning pricing representations, after it was found to be in breach of Australian consumer law.

The ACCC issued Latvian company SIA Booking Group, which operates the EconomyBookings brand, with two infringement notices relating to the manner in which it displayed prices on its website.

Australia's competition regulator alleges EconomyBookings failed to prominently display the total price for car rental services as a single figure.

The ACCC also alleges EconomyBookings made a false or misleading representation about whether a number of pre-selected optional extras were included in the rental price, including "Last Minute Cancellation", "Roadside

assistance" and "Full coverage" for insurance.

EconomyBookings' online reservation process allegedly showed "Your car rental includes" next to a price that did not include the charge for that optional extra.

ACCC Commissioner Luke Woodward said any business offering goods or services to Australian consumers must comply with the country's consumer law.

"Businesses must prominently display the total price of goods and services as a single figure, inclusive of selected optional extras," he said.

"All businesses, including online providers, should ensure that their pricing displays do not mislead consumers." MS

## VA's first int'l flight from CBR



**VIRGIN** Australia has launched its first-ever international service from Canberra, with direct flights to Bali to commence from 22 Jun.

Flights are on sale now, with return fares available from \$399.

Virgin will be the only Australian airline operating internationally out of Canberra.

The new service, which will represent 40,000 flights per year, will operate three return flights per week through to Jan, with the potential to increase frequency during peak periods.

Services will depart Canberra in the afternoon and return overnight from Bali, to maximise convenience for travellers.

Virgin will operate a Boeing 737 on the route, with three seating options including business, economy, and economy x.

VA chief executive officer Dave Emerson said the new service

is a significant win for the ACT, strengthening the territory's international connectivity.

"This is the first time in the history of the company that we will operate internationally from the capital, marking an important milestone in our broader network expansion story," he said.

"As we continue to grow our network, we're focused on offering greater choice and seamless connectivity for our guests," Emerson added.

Virgin Australia's other direct Bali services operate from Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, and the Gold Coast.

The new service also coincides with the airline boosting capacity on its other routes into Canberra this week, upsizing its aircraft on the BNE-CBR route from an F100 operated by Alliance Airlines, to 737s operated by Virgin. MS

## AirAsia boosts ADL

**INDONESIA** AirAsia will soon fly daily between Adelaide and Bali, the South Australian capital's most popular int'l destination.

The airline will go to daily from four flights per week from 22 Mar, following strong demand on the route it first started flying last year (**TD** 10 Apr).

## Tahiti freshens up offering



**FROM** the announcement of Air Tahiti's new business class to the opening of Hotel Reva Tahiti and the launch of a new expedition, the islands of Tahiti are welcoming a range of fresh offerings this year.

Starting on 08 Dec, Air Tahiti will launch Air Tahiti Signature flights on board an ATR aircraft, fully dedicated to business class.

The carrier will operate three roundtrip flights per day between Tahiti, Bora Bora and Raiatea-Tahaa, operating six days per week.

Designed to offer maximum privacy, the cabin will feature 26 seats in a 1:1 configuration, wide seat recline and in-flight entertainment accessible on passengers' personal devices.

In other news, urban getaway Hotel Reva Tahiti has recently opened its doors in the heart of Papeete, located near shops

and restaurants and just a five-minute walk away from the cruise ship terminal.

Meanwhile, new tours through the remote group of Tuamotu Islands have launched, guided by marine conservationist, documentary filmmaker and local Denis Grosmaire.

Through Tuamotu Expeditions, travellers can choose from a four- or five-day trip exploring Arutua, Apataki and Kauruka atolls, while staying at a small family-run guest house on Apataki.

During the tours, guests will admire the marine biodiversity of the islands, swim through pristine coral gardens, enjoy nighttime walks and immerse themselves in local life through cultural experiences with the communities of the atolls.

Group sizes are capped at six pax, while private experiences are also available. *JHM*

## A whale of a time with Swan Hellenic

**SWAN** Hellenic's Cape-to-Cape expedition aboard *Diana* later this year will be joined by two of the world's foremost experts in whale biology, professors Ken Findlay and Jonathan Codd.

The two will lead an immersive science discovery program that will see guests enjoy expert-led lectures and interactive workshops on whale biology, ecology, and conservation, as well as whale identification techniques, population surveys, and the science of migration.

Data collected on board will be shared with citizen science platform HappyWhale, which uses AI image recognition to identify and track whales.

The Rainfall Distillery Gardens, which open next month, will be Australia's first single-estate, closed-loop spirits program where every ingredient originates onsite, supported by beehives, rainwater harvesting and on-estate farming.

## Luxury guests seek value and connection

**FROM** skyrocketing hotel rates to the hottest luxury properties, US-based industry commentator Colin Nagy chatted with Luxury Escapes founder Adam Schwab about luxury's newest trends at an exclusive lunch event at Capella in Sydney yesterday.

"Value sensitivity has really reached the high end of luxury hospitality right now, and what we've seen over the past several years is prices are spiralling [upward]," Nagy said.

"My joke in the US is \$1,000 a night is the new \$500 a night."

According to Nagy, some guests are feeling "like they're being taken for the fool" by brands.

"The word 'value' oftentimes is associated with certain segments of the market, but value is actually very important, even at a property that's \$3,000 a night,"



he said.

"You have to have that emotional connection - and I think that that's really important to call out."

Unfortunately, there are some luxury brands that have "lost a lot of magic" in their quest for "extreme scale", he added.

Nagy hinted at one Hong Kong-based brand "that has been very

overexposed to a lot of Chinese real estate that perhaps has been scaling quite a bit - some properties are very good and they execute well, but others, might not be up to snuff".

However, he also shared some of his favourite luxury properties including Park Hyatt Tokyo, Upper House in Hong Kong, as well as the Montage and Four Seasons. *JHM*

### Conrad unveils the ultimate Ionian escape

**LUXURY** resort Conrad Corfu is set to open in the Greek Islands in the second half of the year, combining privacy and wellness and located an hour's drive away from the island's UNESCO-listed Old Town.

## AirTag ups accuracy

**APPLE** has released the second generation of its AirTag tracking device, designed to help users locate their luggage.

The new model allows users to share location data with more than 50 global carriers, including Qantas, helping them to securely receive a customer's AirTag location data in the event of misplaced luggage.

Additionally, the device now boasts a 50% increased 'precision finding' range and uses haptic, visual, and audio feedback to guide a user to their lost item.
